


General Srilal Weerasooriya Commissioned AMCF President on 18th September 2012

General Srilal Weerasooriya was commissioned as AMCF World President alongside his wife Dilhani, at a ceremony in Colorado Springs, USA on 18th September. The outgoing World President, General Lee, Pil Sup, said prayers for him alongside representatives from MSO, ACCTS and MMI (CE/TL Jos McCabe). General Weerasooriya joined the Sri Lankan Army as an officer cadet in 1963 and after successful completion of training at the Pakistan Military Academy, was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Regiment of Artillery. During his career spanning over 37 years, he rose to command the Sri Lankan army and on his retirement in 2000 he was appointed as Sri Lanka's High Commissioner to Pakistan where he

served until 31st December 2006. Whilst in Pakistan he was a great encouragement to Beniah, the Pakistan MCF. Those who have heard his testimony will also know of his strong Christian witness to heads of state in the region during this time. General Weerasooriya hails from a family which has Christian roots dating back to 1824. He was an active member of the Sri Lankan MCF and served as the AMCF Vice President for South Asia. MMI has worked with General Weerasooriya in his capacity as AMCF Vice President and has been privileged to have both him and his wife, Dilhani speak at our Supporters' Weekend in 2008. We are looking forward to them being with us again at our 2013 Supporters' Weekend this time as AMCF World President.


AMCF grew under General Lee, Pil Sup

A Multi-Confessional embrace of the Balkans

MMI Regional Team Leader for Europe, Revd Grozdan Stoevski, reports on a major missionary trip in the Balkans

In the first half of June, MMI made an “invasion” on the Balkans, led by our Chief Executive & Team Leader, Colonel (Retd) Jos McCabe, accompanied by Rev Mike Terry and myself. The trip included ministry meetings with the military in Bulgaria, Serbia and Croatia. In the city of Nova Zagora (Bulgaria) we met and encouraged the freshly restarted Bulgarian MCF, now under the name of St George the Victor. The organization is mainly Protestant but it is welcoming the Orthodox for collaboration too.

Two days later we shared fellowship with two Serbian Air Force pilots in Novi Sad. One of them is Orthodox, the other is Roman Catholic of the Eastern order, while his wife is Protestant – a micro-version of a multi-confessional MCF!

We were hosted by the monks at the Kovilj Monastery, near Novi Sad, home base of Bishop Porfirje, the priest responsible for introducing chaplaincy in the Serbian Armed Forces. He was very kind not only to share with us the progress of his mission, but also the monks’ breakfast. Later on we made our way to Belgrade where we continued the Chaplaincy introduction discussion with Colonel Karapandzin and his team, who are responsible for it within the Serbian General Staff. We switched gears and drivers on the motorway to Zagreb where our team was joined by Commander (Retd) Brian Parker and Major (Retd) David Baldwin. Our “Multi-confessional approach” “pray and plan” was kindly hosted by



Pastor Mihal Kreko, at Second Baptist Church, Zagreb. A minor motor incident in the narrow streets of Zagreb could not blur our positive impressions of the people and the city. The last meeting and definitely one of the highlights of the trip was the meeting with the Catholic Military Bishop, Monsignor Juraj Jezerinac and his

entourage at the RC Chaplaincy HQ. The Bishop and his Vicar General shared with us how they provide spiritual care for the soldiers. The story of their annual military pilgrimage to Lourdes was inspirational. We saw again how the spiritual needs of soldiers are similar even in different countries.

Differences were made! One delegate had not read the Bible before but was often to be seen immersed in its pages while at sea. He acknowledged

The retreat concluded with corporate, open prayer; a time which was hugely valued by all the participants, several of whom were not accustomed to praying publically. "I have not expected such an informative and high level event. I have got totally new information."



“Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.” (Mat 6:10) is the strong prayer of Brigadier General David Wakaalo, the AMCF VP for East Africa. It is also our prayer as we seek to encourage the Christians in the armed forces to pray for and to work for God’s transformation in this troubled region. We are still hoping and praying for a Prayer Convention for the Region in the near future. “Discussions on this Convention will be central to my visit.” said Major Homfray Vines, MMI’s Regional Team Leader for East & Southern Africa. His visit is scheduled for 27 September to 20 October.

Homfray will visit Kampala where he hopes to discuss the Convention with Brigadier General Wakaalo and Reverend Charles Okongo. During his visit to South Sudan he will visit the Chaplains Training School in Nimule and then attend a workshop in Juba to inaugurate the start their MCF. In Nairobi he will attend a pray and plan for the Convention, which the Kenyans are hoping to be able to hold. Please pray that official permission will be given. The trip will end in Addis Ababa, where Homfray is hoping to meet up with the Defence Christian Fellowship for some teaching sessions.

“Warrior Training” Growing the capability for WC2014

The organisers of the AMCF World Conference have received an ambitious vision: “All nations spiritually transformed through the work of MCF’s in their militaries.” The essence of the Conference vision and mission is to inspire and equip participants to effectively discipline the military men and women of their nations; through establishing and strengthening MCFs in all counties of the world.

As we have been planning this Conference we have been learning that our great God is doing a new thing. Warrior Training is one of them. This event will give all participants the opportunity to learn from God how we can begin to achieve the vision. The programme for this training will be based around the ideas that are emerging for the world conference. For example the pro-

posal to use a 5 phase programme: Phase 1 - **the Gospel**, ensuring that all participants are assured of their Salvation; Phase 2 - **Mission**, helping each participant to explore his/her personal mission; Phase 3 - **Equipping**, giving the participants the necessary ‘tools’ (knowledge, skills and resources); Phase 4 - **Inspiring** the participants and Phase 5 - **Commissioning** the participants.

Central to the training will be teaching on welcoming, hosting, ministry, leadership and communication skills for these young leaders from Southern Africa, who will be playing the major role in hosting the World Conference participants. This teaching will be carried out in a programme surrounded by worship, prayer and the study of God’s word (Joshua 1:8).

MCF Developments in West Africa

Whilst no trips have taken place in these regions in the last few months the Lord is continuing to work out his purposes in the armed forces of countries in West and Francophone Africa.

In **Nigeria** AWAST has now been renamed "The Christian Military Fellowship Support Initiative" (CMFSI). It is to be hoped that this will ease the legal processes necessary to gain formal registration in Nigeria and allow bank accounts to be opened. Our brothers and sisters there need our prayers as sporadic violence continues to plague the country, especially in the central and northern states.

Prayers are also specifically requested to gain entry into **Equatorial Guinea** which is

still the only country in the region not to have had an MCF established.

In **Ghana**, the MCF together with the Christian Police Association has taken delivery of Bibles donated by NMAFBS. No doubt they will be put to good use. The MCF also wishes to use the MMI produced discipleship course, Biblical Service, and we will be getting some copies through to them in September.

The Francophone region remains a difficult area with civil war in **Mali** and growing famine across most of the Sahel region. However, along with AMCF VP Colonel (Retd) Gaston Gnomou I plan to visit the region in the next 6 months to encourage the newly formed MCF in **Niger**.

The new VP takes an active role

Commander (Retd) Saleem Mathew was commissioned last November as the new Association of Military Christian Fellowships (AMCF) Vice-President for South Asia. He is already fully engaged in the role and plans to visit Bangladesh and Nepal this November. This will be his opportunity to see first hand the situation in these countries and meet the wider range of Military Christian Fellowship (MCF) members who normally don't get to the major conferences.

In **Bangladesh** he will experience a situation where very few Christians serve in the military (a total of about 70), whereas in **Nepal** there is a vibrant MCF operating now throughout Nepal with more than 500 members. From his experience of leading Benaiah in Pakistan and his engagement with the project to roll out the MMI discipleship course through the Peshawar diocese he will have much to share. He recently attended the commis-

sioning of his predecessor General Sriyal Weerassooriya in the role of AMCF President. (See Page 1) We praise God with gratitude for the prayerful and financial provision of our supporters who enable MMI to assist the VP in his role of reaching out and encouraging the MCFs to be 'All one in Christ Jesus'.




Assam - Pastures new!

"The fields are white!" says MMI Regional Team Leader, Chris West

We are convinced that the Lord is directing MMI to investigate an additional approach to His work in India. Previously the focus has been in Hindu dominated areas. The Assam regiments are predominately Christian. In response to this leading a visit was made in April this year to Kolkata. With the help of Bishop Ashoke of Kolkata the Regional Team Leader was able to meet a retired commander of the Assam Forces, General Mukherjee. Now with his help RTL, Chris, West accompanied by Colonel (Retd) Paddy Hughes, from the MMI Regional Pray & Plan Group for South Asia, plans to visit Shillong in November to meet military Christians. Our

prayer is that the MMI Biblical Service course will be useful in encouraging Military Christian Fellowships in units – not only in the Assam, Nagaland and Mizoram regions but also when they are deployed on UN operations and amongst their fellow Indian soldiers in Kashmir. This is a step by step approach – first the initial visit to explore potential, now a visit to explore the possibilities then follow-up to build relationships and encourage leaders. A major opportunity will be the World Conference in 2014. Once again, we have deep gratitude for our Lord's provision and guidance and your prayerful support.



Five New MCFs announced in South Korea

MMI Secretary, Mike Paterson, Reports on his participation in the MSO event, Military Evangelism Observation, in June

Our South Korean sister organisation, Mission Support Organisation, hold an annual event, Military Evangelism Observation (MEO) and invite participants from countries without MCFs or from where the MCF is in need of strong encouragement. It is what we call a CATT (Combined Assistance and Training Team) event where the other AMCF Principal Supporting Organisations, MMI and ACCTS USA, assist MSO, primarily with the teaching. It has that special Korean characteristic, enthusiasm for worshipping God (sometimes very early in the morning too!) and on Day 4 when we attend the

opening worship service of the Korean MCF annual National Salvation Prayer Convention alongside 15,000 young Korean servicemen and women we are all caught up in this desire to worship God. It is not surprising that the passion imparted to participants is to see similar events at home in their own countries. This year participants from 5 countries announced the establishment of new MCFs. For me a highlight was to see participants from the same country who historically had been enemies in a civil war hugging each other as Christian brothers.

Brigadier General Dr Samir Haddadin 1940 - 2012

MMI Regional Team Leader (Middle East), Colonel Richard Sandy remembers the AMCF's Vice President for The Middle East

Dr Samir Haddadin, Association of Military Christian Fellowships (AMCF) Vice President for the Middle East, died suddenly on 27th July 2012 following a heart attack. His funeral was held on 28th July and a Memorial Service was held on 22nd August in the Free Evangelical Church in Amman, which I had the honour of attending representing MMI and the wider AMCF family. Dr Samir trained as a dentist and spent 23 years serving in the Medical Services of the Jordan Armed Forces, ending his military career in the rank of Brigadier General. After leaving the Army Dr Samir set up his own dental practice in Amman,

in which he continued to work until last year when his sons took over running the practice. When the idea of a Military Christian Fellowship in Jordan was introduced in 2001, through General Imad Ma'ayah, Dr Samir was one of the first to fully embrace the idea and became its first President. He continued to run the Fellowship, holding the meetings in his home, until he was appointed AMCF Vice President in 2010.

Dr Samir was a wonderful example of a life lived in the service of his Lord. His passing leaves a big hole in the AMCF family in the Middle East and we are praying now for the

right person to be appointed to take his place as Vice President. We also pray for his wife Alia and the family at this time. May they know God's peace and the assurance of knowing Samir is at rest with the Lord.

Arab Spring - Muslim Winter

MMI Regional Team Leader (Middle East) writes on developments in the Middle East

Many of the countries in our Middle East region are experiencing the aftermath of the 'revolutions' that have taken place, and in the case of Syria is still taking place, over the past year and a half – and not all of it is being welcomed by Christians in those countries. In Tunisia and Egypt elections have taken place and new 'governments' have been formed.

As was predicted, the overall 'winners' from the turmoil in Tunisia, Libya and Egypt have been Islamist parties, particularly the Muslim Brotherhood. The political power gained by such parties has given encour-

agement to more fundamentalist Islamic groups, some of whom are advocating the persecution of Christians and the imposition of Islamic (Sharia) law. This has led to a fear amongst both Christians and moderate Muslims of a fundamentalist Islamic form of governance replacing the previous secular regimes in their countries.

The general public in Egypt, Tunisia and Libya are also showing signs of frustration with their new 'governments' which are finding it hard to bring about the benefits that many expected to result from the Arab Spring. In Tunisia

there have been recent violent demonstrations by Salafist groups, against which the police did not intervene. In Egypt there have been demonstrations, albeit quite small in number, against the Muslim Brotherhood party, which party is providing the new President of Egypt. There have also been demonstrations by moderate Muslim and non-Muslim women campaigning for an equal role in society – a key objective of the participants in the Arab Spring.

In Syria, the country appears to be in a state of civil war in which different Islamic groups are fighting for power in that

country. Each side is attracting supporters (armed militia) from outside the country to bolster their cause. All of which leaves Christians in a difficult and threatening situation within the country. As a result many Christians have left their homes to become refugees in the neighbouring countries of Turkey, Lebanon and Jordan. Despite all the turmoil I am pleased to report that to date our contacts within Tunisia, Egypt, Syria and Lebanon are safe and well. They remain inside their country and currently still able to attend their regular church services.
